

1.7 On May 12, 2011, Certificate Holder failed to appear for his scheduled 10:00am personal interview with Board staff and did not call the Board to re-schedule that interview or explain why he was unable to attend.

**-II-
CONCLUSIONS OF LAW**

2.1 The Board has jurisdiction over the certificate holder, Alexander James Dresser, and over the subject matter of this proceeding.

2.2 Mr. Dresser's failure to cooperate with the Board during the course of an investigation is grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to ORS 678.442 (2)(f), OAR 851-063-0080(6) and OAR 851-063-0090(9)(a).

2.3 Mr. Dresser defaulted on the Notice by not requesting a hearing within the allotted 20 days and, accordingly, pursuant to ORS 183.310 to 183.750, the Board may enter a final order by default.

**-III-
ORDER**

Based on the foregoing Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and the Board being fully advised in the premises, it is hereby:

ORDERED that the nursing assistant certificate of Alexander James Dresser is **SUSPENDED** for a **minimum of 14 days**. When Mr. Dresser has complied in all respects with the Board's investigation, and after 14 days, he is eligible to apply for reinstatement and request that the suspension be ended. **This suspension will become effective seven (7) calendar days from the signing of this order.**
