The Oregon State Board of Nursing (Board) is the agency responsible for licensing and regulating certified nursing assistants in the State of Oregon. Joshua Jennings hereinafter referred to as "Certificate Holder," has been a Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA) since March 3, 2009.

In 2009 and 2011, Certificate Holder failed to disclose on his CNA renewal applications that he had been charged with Offensive Littering less than 10 years prior to the date of his signing those applications.

On January 20, 2010, Certificate Holder was arrested for DUII and later convicted of the charge.

On April 26, 2011, Certificate Holder was cited for possession of marijuana and later convicted of the charge.

From November 2011 through May 2012, Certificate Holder failed to provide the Board with documents requested by the Board multiple times.

By the above actions, Certificate Holder is subject to discipline pursuant to the provisions of ORS 678.442 (1), (2)(a)(b)(c)(d)(f); and OAR 851-063-0080 (1), (2), (3), (4), (6); and OAR 851-063-0090 (7)(a), (9)(a)(b)(c) which provides as follows:

ORS 678.442 Certification of nursing assistants; rules.

(1) The Oregon State Board of Nursing shall establish standards for certifying and shall certify as a nursing assistant any person who applies therefor, shows completion of an approved training program for nursing assistants and passes a board approved examination.

(2) In the manner prescribed in ORS chapter 183, the board may revoke or suspend a certificate issued under this section or may reprimand a nursing assistant for the following reasons:

(a) Conviction of the certificate holder of a crime where such crime bears demonstrable relationship to the duties of a nursing assistant. A copy of the record of such conviction, certified to by the clerk of the court entering the conviction, shall be conclusive evidence of the conviction.

(b) Any willful fraud or misrepresentation in applying for or procuring a certificate or renewal thereof.

- (c) Impairment as defined in ORS 676.303.
- (d) Violation of any provisions of ORS 678.010 to 678.445 or rules adopted thereunder.
- (f) Conduct unbecoming a nursing assistant in the performance of duties.

OAR 851-063-0080 Causes for Denial, Reprimand, Suspension, Probation or Revocation of CNA Certificate

Under the contested case procedure in ORS 183.310 to 183.550 the Board may deny, reprimand, suspend, place on probation or revoke the certificate to perform duties as a CNA for the following causes:

- (1) Conviction of the nursing assistant of a crime where such crime bears demonstrable relationship to the duties of a nursing assistant; ORS 678.442(2)(a).
- (2) Any willful fraud or misrepresentation in applying for or procuring a certificate or renewal thereof; ORS 678.442(2)(b).
- (3) Use of any controlled substance or intoxicating liquor to an extent or in a manner injurious to the certificate holder or others or to an extent that such use impairs the ability to conduct safely the duties of a nursing assistant; ORS 678.442(2)(c).
- (4) Violation of any provision of ORS 678.010 to 678.445 or rules adopted thereunder; ORS 678.442(2)(d).
- (6) Conduct unbecoming a nursing assistant in the performance of duties ORS 678.442(2)(f).

OAR 851-063-0090 Conduct Unbecoming a Nursing Assistant

A CNA, regardless of job location, responsibilities, or use of the title "CNA," who, in the performance of nursing related duties, may adversely affect the health, safety or welfare of the public, may be found guilty of conduct unbecoming a nursing assistant. Conduct unbecoming a nursing assistant includes but is not limited to:

- (7) Conduct related to impaired function:
 - (a) Use of drugs, alcohol or mind-altering substances to an extent or in a manner dangerous or injurious to the nursing assistant or others or to an extent that such use impairs the ability to conduct safely the duties of a nursing assistant
- (9) Conduct related to the certificate holder's relationship with the Board:
 - (a) Failing to cooperate with the Board during the course of an investigation. The duty to cooperate does not include waiver of confidentiality privileges, except if a client is harmed. This waiver of confidentiality privileges does not apply to client-attorney privilege.
 - (b) Failing to answer truthfully and completely any question asked by the Board on an application for initial certification, renewal of certification or recertification;
 - (c) Failing to provide the Board with any documents requested by the Board

Certificate Holder admits that the above allegations occurred and constitute violations of the Nurse Practice Act. He wishes to cooperate with the Board in resolving the present matter.

The following will be proposed to the Oregon State Board of Nursing and is agreed to by Certificate Holder:

That the Certified Nursing Assistant certificate of Joshua Jennings be placed on Probation. The Certificate Holder's compliance with this agreement will be monitored by the Oregon State Board of Nursing from date of signature on the Final Order. Certificate Holder must complete a twenty-four (24) month period of probation to begin upon his return to performing the duties at the level of a Certified Nursing Assistant. Certificate Holder must work a minimum of sixteen (16) hours per week and no more than one (1.0) FTE in a setting where he is able to exercise the full extent of scope of duties in order to demonstrate whether he is competent. Limited overtime may be approved on occasion. Any period in which Certificate Holder does not work in the State of Oregon will not count toward the probationary period.

Certificate Holder must comply with the following terms and conditions of probation:

- 1) Certificate Holder shall not violate the Nurse Practice Act (ORS 678) or the rules adopted thereunder.
- 2) Certificate Holder shall have thirty-six (36) months from Board acceptance of this Stipulated Order to complete twenty-four (24) months of monitored performance.
- 3) Certificate Holder shall notify the Board, in writing, prior to any change of address or employment setting, during the probation period.
- 4) Certificate Holder shall maintain an active certificate.
- 5) Certificate Holder shall inform the Board in advance of any absences from Oregon and/or move from Oregon to another licensing jurisdiction. If Certificate Holder leaves the State and is unable to work in the State of Oregon, his probationary status will be re-evaluated.
- 6) Certificate Holder shall present himself, in person or by phone, to designated Board staff for interviews on a monthly basis during the probationary period. Frequency of contact may be reviewed and revised periodically at the discretion of Board staff.
- 7) Certificate Holder shall notify the Board of any citations, arrests, or convictions for any offense, whether a felony, misdemeanor, violation, or citation within seven (7) days of the occurrence.
- 8) Certificate Holder will not look for, accept, or begin a new nursing assistant position without the approval of the Board. This includes changes of the employer itself or changes within the facility or institution.
- 9) Certificate Holder shall inform current and prospective employers of the probationary status of his certificate, the reasons for his probation, and terms and

conditions of probation. If there is a Nurse Executive, that person is to be informed of Certificate Holder's probationary status. The Nurse Executive will receive copies of the Stipulated Order for Probation and Board Order when Certificate Holder is employed.

- 10) Certificate Holder shall work under the direct supervision of another licensed healthcare professional, functioning at a higher level of licensure, who is working in the same physical location and readily available to observe performance and provide assistance. Certificate Holder shall be employed in a setting where his nursing supervisor agrees to submit written evaluations of work performance (on forms provided by the Board) every three (3) months during the probationary period. The nursing supervisor must submit the quarterly evaluation within 10 days of the due date. If the evaluation is not received at such time, Board staff will contact the employer to remind them. If the Board does not receive the report within 5 business days from the time the employer is contacted, the probationer will be restricted from performing the duties of a nursing assistant.
- 11) Between regular reporting periods, the Nurse Executive or comparable person, shall inform the Board of any instance of the probationer's non-compliance with the terms and conditions of this Stipulated Order for Probation, or of any other concern there may be regarding his work-related conduct or personal behavior that may affect his ability to perform the duties of a nursing assistant.
- 12) Certificate Holder shall notify the Board when there is a change in status of employment including resignations or terminations.
- 13) Certificate Holder shall not work in any work setting in which on-site supervision is not available. This generally includes home health agencies, traveling agencies, float pools, temporary agencies, assisted living facilities, adult foster care, independent consulting contracts, home hospice, and night shifts outside of acute care settings.
- 14) Certificate Holder shall not be allowed to participate in the CNA2 training per Division 62.
- 15) Certificate Holder shall participate and comply with any treatment recommendations as set forth by a third party evaluator. Within fourteen (14) days of treatment completion, Certificate Holder shall submit to the Board a copy of his completion certificate or discharge summary. Certificate Holder shall attend NA, AA (or a similar 12-step program) on a weekly basis and provide proof of attendance to Board staff.
- 16) Certificate Holder shall participate in the Board's random urine program. Failure to comply with the random urine program will result in an immediate removal from the performance of nursing assistant duties. Certificate Holder shall submit to tests to determine the presence of unauthorized substances immediately upon request by Board staff or the employer. Certificate Holder shall sign any release

of information necessary to ensure the Board will receive the results of such testing. The presence of unauthorized substances may be considered a violation of the terms and conditions of this Stipulated Order. Certificate Holder will obtain an evaluation by a Board approved chemical dependence evaluator upon request of the probation coordinator. Certificate Holder understands that he will be financially responsible for any costs related to testing and evaluation. Failure to keep the account with the Board's lab vendor in good standing will be considered a violation of this agreement.

- 17) Certificate Holder shall abstain from the use of intoxicating, mind altering, or potentially addictive drugs, both over-the-counter and prescription drugs, and alcohol during the period of probation. Certificate Holder shall avoid any over the counter products and food items containing alcohol and poppy seeds.
- 18) Certificate Holder may take medication for a documented medical condition, provided that he obtains such medication only by a legal prescription written by a person authorized by law to write such a prescription. Certificate Holder will notify the Board within 72 hours in the event he is prescribed such medication, and shall authorize the prescribing person to communicate with the Board about his medical condition. Certificate Holder shall produce the medical records pertaining to the medical condition and medication use. Certificate Holder will discard any unused prescription medications when it is no longer needed or expired.
- 19) Certificate Holder shall cease the performance of duties as a nursing assistant upon the occurrence of a relapse or at the request of the probation coordinator because of relapse or relapse behavior. Performance of duties may resume when approved by Board staff, in consultation with the employer.
- 20) Certificate Holder will notify any health care providers of the nature of his chemical dependence diagnosis to ensure that his health history is complete before receiving any treatment, including medical and dental treatment. Certificate Holder will provide a copy of this Stipulated Order to the provider. Certificate Holder further agrees to provide the Board with the names of any health care providers, sign releases of information with the providers, and provide the Board with documentation of the health care provided (medical records). Certificate Holder is financially responsible for any costs incurred as a result of compliance with the terms and conditions of this Stipulated Order.
- 21) Certificate Holder shall notify the Board at least three (3) business days prior to leaving town or going on vacation with the exception of a family emergency.
- 22) Certificate Holder shall cooperate fully with the Board in the supervision and investigation of his compliance with the terms and conditions of this Stipulated Order.
- 23) Certificate Holder shall participate and comply with any treatment

recommendations, such as continued medication management and psychotherapy, as set forth by a medical professional determined to be qualified by the probation coordinator.

Certificate Holder understands that the conduct resulting in the violations of law, described in this Stipulated Order are considered by the Board to be of a grave nature and if continued, constitutes a serious danger to public health and safety.

Certificate Holder also understands that in the event he engages in future conduct resulting in violations of the law or terms of probation the Board may take further disciplinary action against his certificate, up to and including revocation of his certificate to perform duties as a certified nursing assistant.

Certificate Holder understands that this Stipulated Order will be submitted to the Board of Nursing for approval and is subject to the Board's confirmation.

Certificate Holder understands that by entering into this stipulated agreement, he waives the right to an administrative hearing.

Certificate Holder states no promises, representation, duress, or coercion has been used to induce him to sign this Stipulated Order.

Certificate Holder understands that this Stipulated Order is a public record.

Certificate Holder has read this Stipulated Order, understands the Stipulated Order completely, and freely signs the Stipulated Order.
